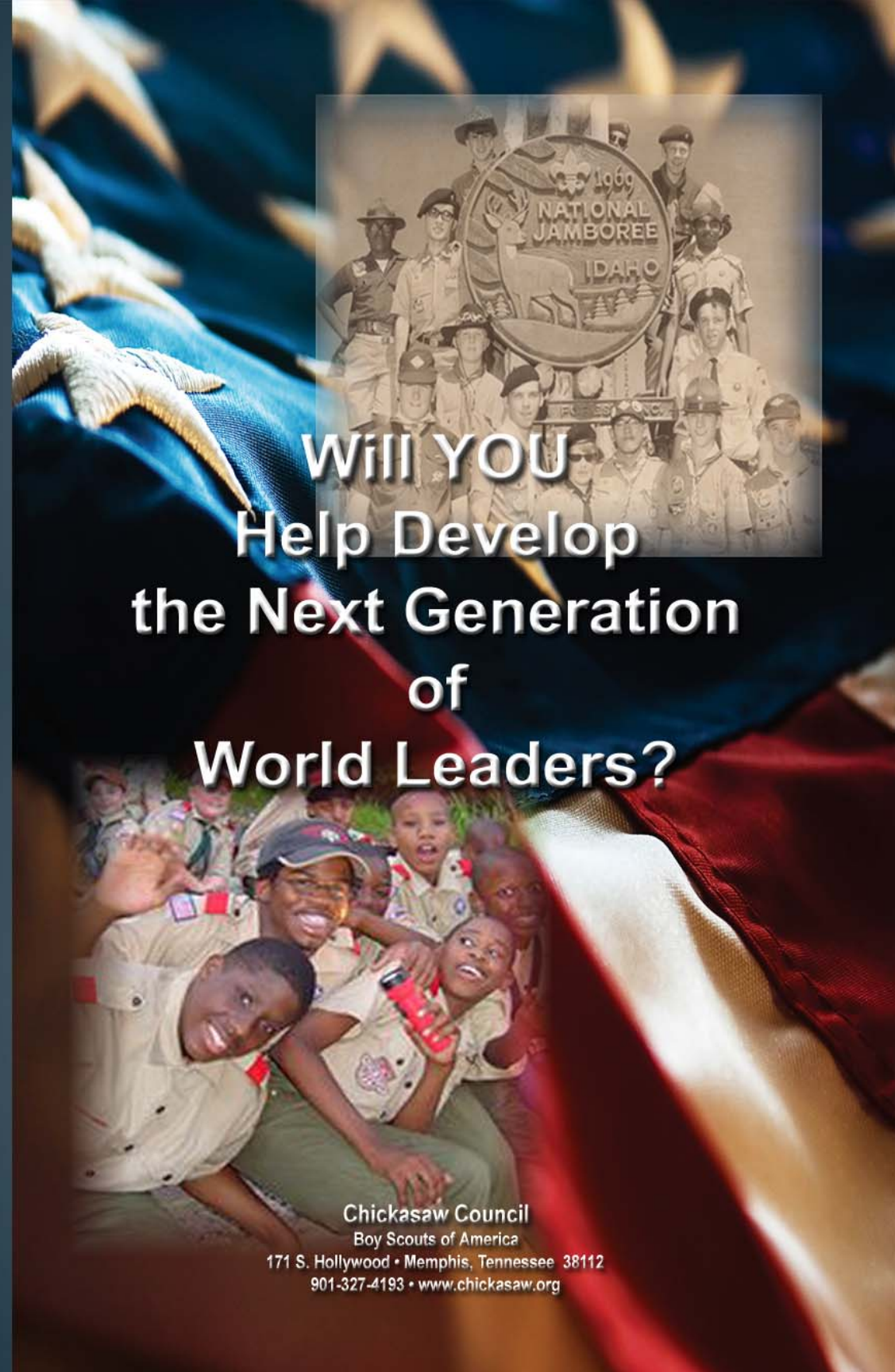
### Sporting Clays Shootout

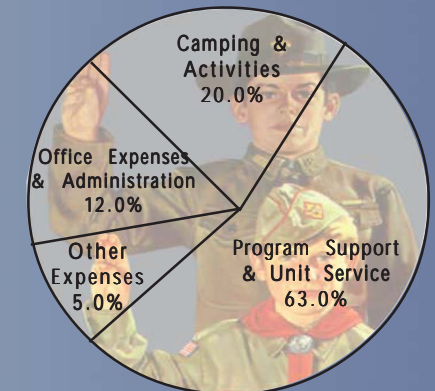
